



- The data for Round 15 of the Return Index was collected from January to March.
- During Round 15, three additional locations of return were assessed, but the overall number of locations remained the same due to families displacing from two locations previously assessed in Round 14 and the combination of two locations into one in Round 15.

# Overall severity




- Out of the 2,165 return locations assessed, 453 present severe conditions hosting 12 per cent of the returnee population, or 581,112 individuals.
- This was a decrease of 20,802 returnees living in severe conditions since the last round (October-December 2021 – 601,914 individuals or 12%)
- The largest decreases were recorded in Anbar (12,780) and Diyala (3,270).

Subdistricts are classified as ‘hotspots’ if they score highly in terms of severity on at least one of the two scales (either livelihoods and basic services, or safety and social cohesion) or if they score medium in terms of severity but also host relatively large numbers of returnees. In this round, the criteria for selecting hotspots was revised and set to at least 60,000 returnees for a subdistrict in medium category to be considered highly populated and to be included to the list of hotspots.

# Update on the ILA

- ILA is ongoing and datasets + dashboards can be expected by Mid-August
- All return and displacement locations with 5 HH or more are covered
- All informal sites with 5 HH of more will be mapped, and settlements with 15 HH or more will be surveyed (about 25 questions)
- The next ML will be for April – June
- The next RI will be for July - September
