

East Anbar ABC Focal Point


- Mercy Hands is selected as the third focal point

- Workshop with ICCG members?


Call for new ABC members

E Anbar Coordination-in-practice session (deep dive conducted, 27 Apr) on Al Garma District



Notes

- 9 enumerators for 40 working days
- Travel and support: 4 REACH drivers to provide transportation to the enumerators for 35 days

Number of target host community & Districts

- 10 districts (Erbil, Sumail, Sinjar, Al-Fallujah, Baquba, Tooz Khurmato, Al Rutba, Al-Baaj, Al-Hawiga, and Al-Hatra (pending security))
- Approximately 1,300 host community members





Structure, Leadership and Membership



Transition Focus

Nexus Approach - DS requires engagement from humanitarian, development, stabilization and peacebuilding actors

A. National Structure ---DSTWG

Technical guidance, advocacy, 4Ws mapping (national/countrywide), exit strategy, knowledge transition

B. Sub-National ---- ABC Groups

Area level mapping, planning, implementation, coordination, analysis of target locations (PoAs),

A. Transition proposal – National level

- Aim: For DSTWG to determine how, and what current humanitarian coordination functions and technical expertise can be integrated within DS structures as clusters transition?
- Will depend on cluster transition plans
- Transition of humanitarian structures into the DSTWG would help with the following:
 - Ensure that remaining **technical capacities and implementation are leveraged** to contribute to a shared goal of achieving Durable Solutions, doing so in a coordinated manner
 - **Retain the cluster technical expertise** and would ensure continuity for the residual humanitarian needs and provide for smoother links with longer term programming
 - **Enable technical engagement with government** to allow for capacity building and institutions strengthening

A. Challenges for consideration-DSTWG

- Durable Solutions goals of the architecture vs cluster goals
- Reconciliation of different approaches, government engagement/partnership and humanitarian sensitive issues?
- Issues that do not fall within DS sectors, eg humanitarian access

B. Transition proposal – Sub-Nat level ABCs

Key considerations between sub-national coordination:

- Objectives (humanitarian versus DS)
- Capacity (dedicated full-time staff versus volunteer double-hatting FP/IM Support)
- Geographical coverage (governorate versus area-based)
- Clarity on what roles/responsibilities to be absorbed and reconciled with work of ABCs


But handover to the ABCs:

- Would enable multi-sectoral joint mapping and implementation of activities at the local level
- Facilitate joint local level engagement with authorities

B. Transition proposal – Sub-National level (DS ABCs)

- Options:
 - 1. ABCs when existing integrate some key functions of clusters (but areas not covered by ABC remains un-addressed)
 - 2. Governorate level “transitional” forum with an area-level focus (POAs for Hotspot Areas) prioritization based on need and partner presence
 - Eg Kirkuk with a focus on Hawija and other areas such as Debis and Daquq as secondary
- Considerations for decisions:
 - Clarity needed from clusters on what roles/responsibilities will be handed over and how those can be reconciled with the work of the ABCs
 - Resource needs for the work of the ABCs, full time focal points, IM support?
