Assessment Report Findings

Largest village of the 13 villages with a population of 1200HH according to government figures.

Recent Update:

266HH returned to the village in August

Government has committed to supporting some components of infra rehab.



Assessment Report Findings

Sectors

WATER

- Currently water trucking used, WTP used for camps but no network for village
- Ninewa authorities are working on rehabilitating the network

EDUATION

- 2 schools partially damaged one school completely damaged
- Plans

HEALTH

- Plans presented but advocacy needed to obtain budget
- Temporary use of Mosque as PHC

HOUSING

- 80% of housed partial damage
- 20% completely damaged
- Low rate of compensation for damaged property.



Selection of DSTWG Co-chair following withdrawal of NRC

Bring Hope Humanitarian Foundation selected via a process led by DRC

Summary of Bring Hope Foundation

- Operating in Iraq since 2014
- Portfolio includes humanitarian-protection, resilience, livelihoods, peacebuilding and climate change programs.



Sinjar ABC:

- October ABC meeting agreed on formalizing co-focal point position of the Ninewa Governorate and appointing a back up focal point among the local NGOs.

Amendment to the ABC TOR

Comparison

- Selection of Focal Points and Membership
- Focal Point Selection Criteria
- Insertion of inclusion of government local authorities, administrative units
- No requirement for submission of interest for government entities
- Insertion of focal point selected from governorate body
- Insertion of clause encouraging local organizations to apply for aid actor FP
